

IN MEMORIAM

PROFESSOR RADMILA HRISOHO



It is with deep sadness that we inform you that Professor Radmila Hrisoho passed away on February 21st, 2023.

Professor Radmila Hrisoho was born on April 21, 1930 in Skopje. She graduated from the Department of Chemistry at the Faculty of Natural Sciences and

Mathematics in Skopje in 1953, with an average grade of 9.53.

Professor Radmila Hrisoho founded the Biochemistry Laboratory at the Clinic for Internal Medicine in Skopje in 1955, and she worked there until her retirement in 1992. She was a Head of the Institute for Clinical Biochemistry for almost two and a half decades. She became the first specialist in medical biochemistry in Macedonia in 1961, and on December 12th, 1965 she defended her doctoral thesis titled: »A contribution to the quantitative determination of iodine layers and hormonal iodine in the blood« at the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Mathematics in Skopje. In 1969, she was elected a scientific associate researcher in the subject of internal medicine.

In her rich and fruitful teaching and scientific activity, she introduced modern analyses and methods into clinical laboratory medicine. She also taught at the Cathedra of Biochemistry and Clinical Biochemistry at the Faculty of Medicine in Skopje as a full professor. Professor Hrisoho dedicatedly worked with her candidates as a mentor for Master's theses and doctoral dissertations, selflessly imparting her rich scientific research experience and knowledge. She managed many research projects and published over 150 professional and scientific papers in various national and international journals.

Professor Hrisoho was a long-time member of the Society of Medical Biochemists of Yugoslavia

(DMBJ) Presidency and the organiser of 2 symposiums within the DMBJ – in Struga in 1989 and in Ohrid in 1990. She was the founder and first president of the Society of Medical Biochemists of Macedonia (1990–1922) and a BCLF Board Member.

She used her vast knowledge and wrote a book titled »Development of biochemical laboratory activity in Macedonia« which was published in 2002 and promoted at the Macedonian Academy of Sciences and Arts.

Although with impaired mobility, prof. Radmila Hrisoho attended the opening ceremony of the BCLF Meeting in 2018, held in Skopje. On April 7, 2020, on the occasion of World Health Day, the Macedonian Medical Society awarded the »Trifun Panovski« award to Professor Hrisoho for her lifetime achievement in the field of laboratory medicine.

Professor Radimila Hrisoho, a doctor of biochemical sciences and full professor of Biochemistry at the Faculty of Medicine in Skopje, lived to a very old age; she left us at the age of almost 93 years. We will remember her as an extremely hardworking, energetic, full of life, compassionate, honest professor and woman. She was extremely organized, efficient, and maximally dedicated to family and work, managing to achieve top results in all fields.

The Faculty of Medicine will be forever grateful to her for everything she did through her self-sacrificing work and dedication to the faculty through her students, interns, and master and doctoral students. It is difficult to admit the fact that she is no longer among us but she will continue to live in our hearts, through the love and memories that we carry for our beloved and respected teacher, parent, colleague, and friend.
